

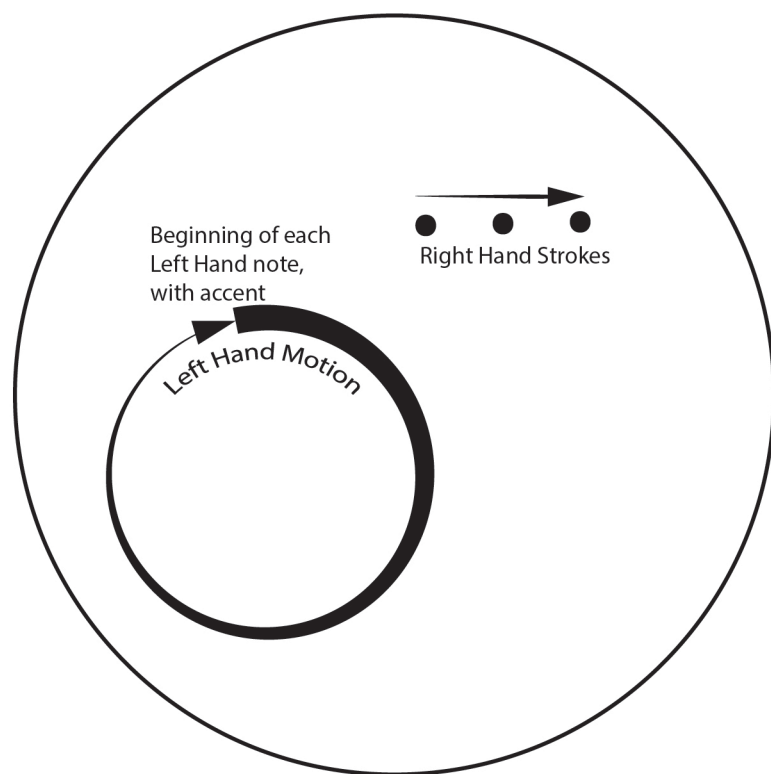
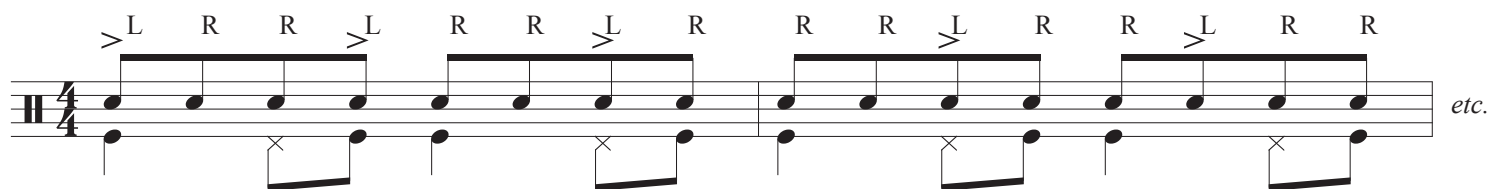
# Nebraska Music Education Association - Jazz Drum Kit Style Patterns, **Set C**

## Jazz Drum Set

Play the three styles listed below at the indicated tempo for 16 measures, with a fill at the end of each first eight-measure phrase. Each two-measure example is only a suggestion to be used as a point of departure. You may play an appropriate stylistic variation of each groove, utilizing more musical possibilities. Each style pattern should be recorded as a separate track.

### 1. Bossa Nova with Brushes

Bossa Nova (♩ = c. 116)



THE RIGHT HAND taps with a slight sweeping motion from left to right. The far left dot is approximately where you strike the head on the first of two consecutive notes. The middle dot represents where you strike the head for the second of two consecutive notes. The far right dot represents where you strike the head for the third of three consecutive notes (and of 1 in bar 2).

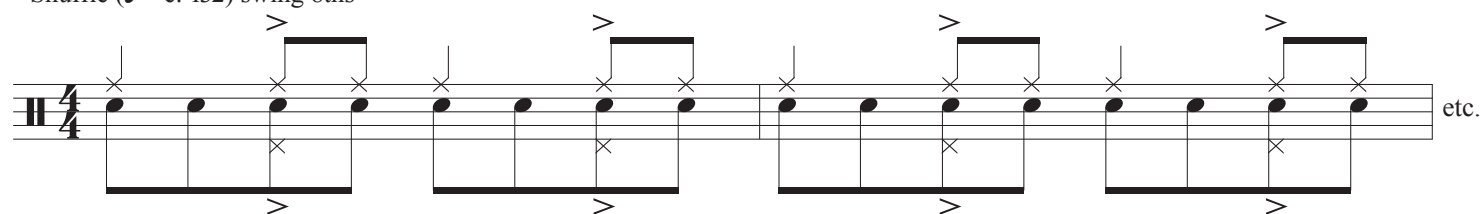
THE LEFT HAND plays the Bossa Nova clave pattern and “stirs” in a clockwise motion. Each note starts at the top of the circle and then stays in contact with the head as it circles around. Time it so that each left hand note hits at the top of the circle. Lift the brush off of the head just before you get to the top of the circle so that you can come down and accent the next note.

Suggest you practice the right and left hand pattern without any “sweeping” or “stiring” motion first. Add the motion when you are comfortable with the sticking.

### 2. Jazz Shuffle with Sticks

Shuffle (♩ = c. 132) swing 8ths

Shuffle groove on snare, accent 2 & 4



3. Funk-Rock with Sticks

Funk-Rock (♩ = c. 108)
